Since opening last December, nary a food journalist has failed to praise this new restaurant located in the former premises of the "Table de Joël Robuchon". At the head of this new designer setting decorated by Anne-Cécile Comar, you will find Jean-Louis Nomicos, formerly of Lasserre (two Michelin stars). But there's no déjà-vu in the dining room – an original cocoon of woven wooden slates – and a scent of the new all the way to the wine list... offered on an iPad! Apple's digital tablet also serves as a screen to view images of the creation of certain dishes, including the famous macaroni with black truffles and foie gras (offered as a first course, €45). Nomicos's classical yet creative cuisine shows a Mediterranean influence with the crispy red mullet with marjoram (€39) and the Lozère lamb with sweet spices (€38). An interesting dessert menu offers, among other dishes, a green Chartreuse soufflé (€14) and a fine chocolate soufflé tart (€16). If this soaring cuisine deserves its first Michelin star, the service, friendly enough, does not work to its advantage. Whether or not they are understaffed, the waiters are quickly overwhelmed. But perhaps it is still a bit early to ask too much, only a few weeks after opening. Yet while
